Year 6 homework project options for term 3

Below are five options for homework projects for this term. Each project incorporates different skills and you should choose at least one of these to complete before the end of term. Each project has a number of house points attached to it; we have allocated the number of house points according to the level of difficulty/time needed for each project.

Although you may choose to complete more than one project we must stress that it is quality not quantity that counts; we would rather receive one well-researched, carefully thought out and beautifully presented project than three rushed pieces.

All projects should be returned to school no later than Monday 5th February.

Project	Number of House Points Achievable
1) Interview a relative or family friend about their wartime experiences or memories. Write down or record their responses.	10
2) Make a scrapbook of Second World War images and write captions for each one. Consider how the people in the pictures may be feeling.	10
3) Make do and mend! Can you revamp some of your old clothing to make new clothes? Take 'before' photos and bring in the new item.	15
4) Imagine that you are an evacuee: you're allowed to take just one book with you to your new home. Which one would you take? Write a book review explaining what the book is about, who would enjoy it and why you would choose this book over others.	12
5) Imagine a child has been evacuated to your home. How would you make them feel welcome? How would you support them if they were missing their home or family? Which places in your local area would you like to show them? This could be presented as a Power Point presentation if you wish.	10
