## Term 3 - Year 2 homework project options

Below are five options for homework projects for this term. Each project incorporates different skills and you should choose at least one of these to complete before the end of term. Each project has a number of house points attached to it; we have allocated the number of house points according to the level of difficulty/time needed for each project.

Although you may choose to complete more than one project we must stress that it is quality not quantity that counts; we would rather receive one well-researched, carefully thought out and beautifully presented project than three rushed pieces.

All projects should be returned to school in the week beginning 5<sup>th</sup> February. We will then arrange a time for parents to come in to view your finished work in the last week of term.

| Project  | Number of House Points Achievable |

| 1) Search the web or non-fiction books to find out about a famous boat or ship. Make an information book by writing down interesting facts, downloading images and / or making drawings.               | 15                                |
| 2) Make your own pirate treasure chest using a lidded box and other recycled materials. What will you keep in your treasure chest? Bring it into school to show the class and explain how you made it. | 15                                |
| 3) Make a map of your home and local area to show all the main features.   | 15                                |
| 4) Find and learn some pirate jokes. Practise reading them at home to perform in school and make your pirate friends laugh.  | 10                                |
| 5) Make a poster for a holiday destination a pirate might want to visit. Look at travel brochures and holiday websites to help you.  | 10                                |
| 6) Look at pirates from different stories and films. Choose your favourite pirate. Draw him/her and write a character profile.   | 10                                |
