Below you will see computers from the 1930's

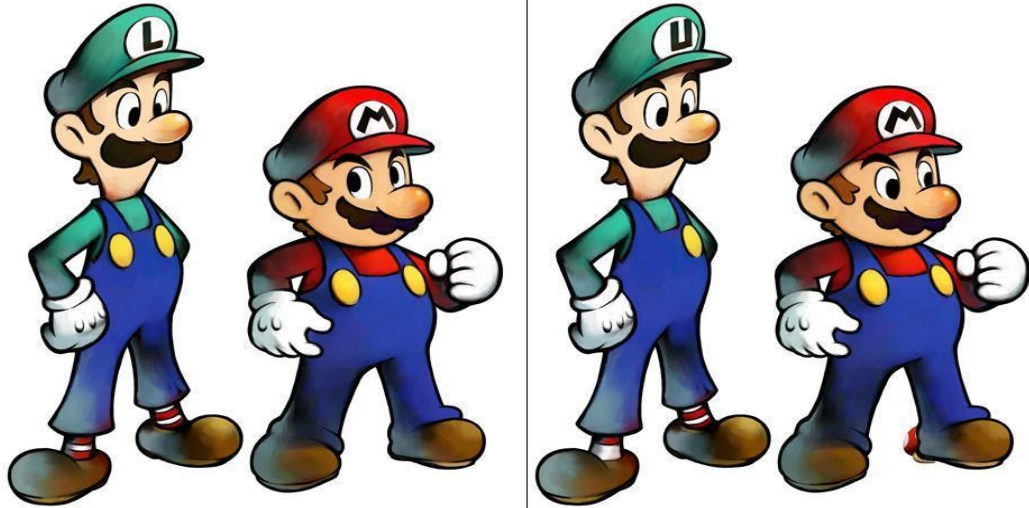


compared to now in 2017.
