

PSHE

In PSHE, we will be looking at the different work charities do around the world, focussing on the help they provide for disaster areas. We will also be considering the responsibilities we hold in school and at home.

Computing

In computing, we will be recapping our Presentation skills in PowerPoint, and over the course of the term will be developing a presentation using our own

Geography

In geography this term, we will be learning how to appropriately use atlases to identify different countries, continents and mountain ranges across the world.

PE

English

Art

We will be studying the landscape works of Monet over the course of our Art this term. We will also be looking at the Mountain art of Albert Bierstadt.

RE

During RE, we will be considering whether miracles are real and looking at the purpose behind a religious text, and considering how they help people understand their religion.

Music

In music, we will be learning about a range of modern musical genres, such as; hip-hop and grime, and comparing to genres already learned.

Maths

We will be beginning our term by reasoning with measures, then moving on to discovering equivalence, and finishing off with fractions.

Science

We will be looking at Humans including Animals over the course of this term. This will include considering food chains, the identification of different animal species, and the similarities and differences amongst humans and animals.
